

Council: January 23, 2018 · 3:30-5 p.m. at the MTA CC

- 1. You will be voting on the three-year calendar package at this Council meeting. Calendar Committee Chairperson Alma Ora (SUE) will present the calendar package for Council approval. The Calendar Committee has agreed to calendars for three consecutive school years: 2018-2019, 2019-2020, and 2020-2021. The Committee includes District and CSEA representatives. The Calendar Committee was successful in negotiating multi-year agreements to aide in professional and personal planning. The calendars are available for review on MontebelloTeachers.org. The Questions and concerns can be directed to Calendar@MontebelloTeachers.org. The Board of Education is expected to be approved the calendar package at the February 1 meeting.
- 2. The Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Committee has begun reviewing the progress on the 2017-2018 goals in preparation for development of the 2018-2019 LCAP. The LCAP Committee includes representatives from stakeholder groups including: MTA, CSEA, AMSA, DO, parents and students. A survey will be sent to Bargaining Unit members via personal emails in the beginning of February.

The LCAP Goals

- 1. Maintain appropriately assigned credentialed teachers, appropriate staffing, sufficient access to standards-aligned instructional materials, and facilities.
- 2. Close the achievement gap for all students by promoting academic preparedness and career readiness.
- 3. Maintain safe and innovative environments that foster learning.
- 4. Foster a district/school climate that ensures communication with all stakeholders and their participation towards attaining district Local Control and Accountability Plan (LCAP) goals.
- 3. Bargaining Chairperson Larry McKiernan (SUI) will report on negotiations. The First Interim was approved by the Board of Education December 21. Any possible increase for the 2017-2018 salary will be determined following study of the First Interim. Larry will also discuss the upcoming bargaining survey for 2018-2019 negotiations which are scheduled to begin this spring.
