

## **TOPICS OF INTEREST THIS QUARTER**

Governor's Budget: CTA and organizations representing the education coalition are mounting massive mobilization of their members. The governor's proposed budget breaks the promise of his agreement to pay schools \$2.3 billion owed to them under the constitutional guarantee. He is trying to undermine public education's school funding guarantee by changing Proposition 98. He is also proposing to eliminate the state responsibility for their contribution to the State Teacher's Retirement System. Although the Governor's propose spending plan would provide a 3.93% COLA schools would still lose \$469 million for 2005/06. He would propose that districts shift this coast to teachers through the collective bargaining process. To become law, the governor's proposals have to be approved by lawmakers.

Facilities Update: Applications for the Citizen Bond Oversight Committee are now available. The Committee will include a minimum of 7 members. The board will make the appointments on Feb 17<sup>th</sup>. This committee's main purpose will be to review expenditures and to look for cost saving measures. Measure M will meet the spirit of the critically overcrowded schools funding regulation. Pam Johnson and her department will handle this bond measure. Negotiations of the take over agreement with the bonding company for BGH is still in progress. The district has assumed the concrete and asphalt work.

**Budget Status:** The Auditor's finding for the year ending June 30<sup>th</sup> 2004 has been concluded. Montebello Unified continues its positive status. The First Interim Report projects financial solvency for the current and subsequent two fiscal years.

**Gate:** MHS GATE committee sent the superintendent a letter expressing concerns over the lack of funding for the program. A joint memo has been developed and will be sent explaining the Gate Funding Program. This memo will hopefully explain and clarify why there is a per student funding decline.
