

Don't Sign the Governor's

Governor Schwarzenegger has made it official. He jumped into his Hummer and left town to raise money for his so-called reform initiatives. You will see his *paid* signature-gatherers in your neighborhood. They might even ask you to sign, "to help schools".

CTA is asking members <u>not</u> to sign any of these petitions!

Public School Teachers. Waiting Period for Permanent Status. Dismissal - This eliminates the current probationary two-year period and increases it to five years.

Public Employee Union Dues. Required Employee Consent for Political Contributions. This proposal by Lewis L. Uhler is an attempt to silence the voices of teachers, firefighters, police officers and other public employees in the political process by entangling unions in useless paperwork.

Prohibition on Defined Benefit Public Pensions - This eliminates a secure pension for teachers and all public employees. It replaces the current defined benefit plan through STRS with a risky, 401(k)-style retirement plan.

Redistricting. Initiative Constitutional Amendment -

This is a redistricting plan that calls for a panel of Governor appointed retired judges to redraw voting districts before the next general elections.
