- How to make a difference in the Association and the education of students.

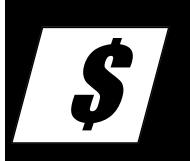

Worker's Compensation Update

You May Pre-Designate a Physician
You may advise the Risk Management in writing
before an injury that, if hurt on the job, you wish
to be treated by your personal physician. The doctor must agree to be the treating physician. It is a
good idea for the doctor to sign the predesignation form. He or she must be the Bargaining Unit member's regular physician, with an existing medical record and history of care.

Bargaining Unit members may complete a predesignation form which is available through Risk Management. The form must be submitted to Risk Management and a copy of the form should be kept as a personal record.

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TOPICS OF INTEREST THIS QUARTER

Facilities Update: Citizen Bond Oversight Committee met with architect for JGE proposed plans. The modernization projects at WGE, JGE, and BAE are close to completion. The elevator project at MHS, SHS, and CCE are almost completed. The District has reached a settlement agreement with the insurance company with regard to the BGHS project. Due to the decline in enrollment a savings is being made with portables because they are being sent back.

Program Improvement: Noreen Arasi and Todd Macy identified the PI schools and the four categories that these schools fall under. Interventions provided by the schools were reviewed. Discussion took place concerning Macy being the only "choice" school at the intermediate level and the concerns of trying to accommodate the current influx. There was discussion also concerning vendors who provide private tutoring. Interest for these services is growing.

Transportation: Transportation cost will be increased beginning July 1, 2007. Increases will be as followed: from \$1.50 per mile to \$2.30 per mile and hourly rate from \$28.00 to \$31.50. Anyone interested in meeting with the new transportation manger concerning end of the year field trips please contact me. We will be setting up a question and answer session in the very near future.

Budget: Glen Sheppard reported that our ADA has declined in 2005-06. We are currently down approximately 1000-1200 students. New state revenues are as followed:
