Proficiency Standards Vary from State to State

An Article in the October 10, 2007 *Education Week* focuses on the wide variation in cutoff points for state proficiency standards utilized in the No Child Left Behind (NCLB) federal law. According to the article, *The Proficiency Illusion,* released by the Thomas B. Fordham Foundation shows that states set widely differing cutoff points for determining how well a student must perform in order to qualify as "proficient" in reading and math under NCLB. The table to the left lists the estimated percentile rank needed to meet the third grade standard in 26 states, based on the Measure of Academic Progress (MAP), a computerized diagnostic test. *California standards are comparatively extremely high.*
