PAR Consulting Teacher Applications Due February 28 - Earn \$500

All interested tenured teachers are encouraged to apply to become a PAR Consulting Teacher for 2013-14. Please read the PAR Rules and Procedures and complete the application. Note: The application must be submitted by 4:00pm on February 28, 2014. Consulting Teachers earn \$500 upon appointment.

A Consulting Teacher (CT) is a classroom teacher who provides assistance to a RPT pursuant to the PAR program.

A consulting teacher must meet the following requirements:

- a. be a fully credentialed classroom teacher.
- b. have permanent status.

c. have taught in a classroom setting for the past three (3) consecutive years and have had a minimum of five (5) years of classroom teaching in MUSD.

The CT application and information regarding this additional assignment is made available in January of each year.
