

CTA Continues to Protect Teachers Due Process Rights

President Lorraine Richards joined CTA President Dean Vogel at a Press Conference highlighting the Vergara Teacher Rights Court Case Thursday, February 20. President Vogel along with other speakers reported corporate special interests are trying to scapegoat the legislative process and strip teachers of the professional and due process rights they've had for more than 80 years.

Vergara v. State of California, aims to overturn due process protections for teachers. It began on January 27 and is ongoing - possibly for several more weeks. If upheld, it will make it harder to attract and retain quality teachers in our schools. The lawsuit alleges that California laws governing teacher dismissals, attainment of permanent status




and layoffs are unconstitutional and should be eliminated. The allegations—which are baseless and meritless—circumvent input by local parents and educators through the legislative process. CTA and the California Federation of Teachers (CFT) got involved in this lawsuit to ensure all stakeholders have input in education policy decisions and to protect the rights of educators for the sake of the students they teach.

Late afternoon Thursday, February 20, the state filed a motion for judgment stating plaintiffs have failed to meet their burden. Court is in recess until March 4 when oral arguments on the motion will occur. If the judge denies the motion the case will likely begin March 5.
