

TOPICS OF INTEREST THIS QUARTER

Budget Status Update: Cheryl Plotkin

Local Control Funding Formula (LCFF) is the State's new funding method for public education. MUSD stands to benefit from the new funding formula. LCFF increases funding for low-income, English Learners, free and reduced lunch participants. MUSD would need to prepare reports on CALPADS by March. The District has simplified the parent form and it is available on-line. MUSD is estimating that 83% of our students qualify for extra funding. LCFF funding amounts will be released in January.

MUSD Head Start will now be receiving funds directly from the federal government for a three-year grant cycle. This will benefit the District with an increase of funding for indirect costs. Approximately 45% to 50% of the MUSD students have attended Head Start.

Enrollment Report & Class Size: Art Revueltas

Enrollment has declined 958 students. Class size of grades K and 1st are smaller than last year. Senior class is the largest class with 2,457 students. The District has declined by 7,000 students since our height of enrollment in the 2003-2004. The National birth rate is at its lowest since 1907.

In the next 8 years the State will require K-3 to reduce class size to 24 to 1. The state will progressively fund the class size reduction each year. This will result in a reduction of class size to 32 to 1 for K-3 by April 2014. The District will be hiring 7 more teachers this year.

Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium: Bob Geiger & Lourdes Hale

IT is prepared for Smarter Balance Assessment Consortium (SBAC) computer based testing. STAR testing will be replaced by CaLMAPP (California Measurement of Academic and Program Performance). The State will be field-testing SBAC in the spring. There will be a 3-year grace period for new test score accountability.

Facilities Update: Don Yamagata

WAE two-story building construction is scheduled to be complete May of 2014. JGE will have a new entrance that improves campus safety. LMI and Maintenance Yard staff parking lots have been repaved and restriped. SHS Varsity Baseball Field has completed their ADA compliance upgrades. HMC Architects will be providing SHS plans for a new synthetic football field, track and visitors' bleachers.

Energy Savings: Don Yamagata & Derrick Williams

The District saved \$1.25M in the 2012-13 school year. Spring shutdown saved \$186K and August shutdown saved \$235K.
