CTA seeks member input about strategic plan prior to January vote

"CTA's new Strategic Plan - "Our Union, Our Future" - centers around building an organizing culture in CTA - so that members are continually engaged, and so that we are continually talking with and, more importantly, listening to each other," said CTA President Dean Vogel. "The goal of the process from the very beginning was to listen to what members were saying and build a plan around their vision. It fosters community engagement, and offers more chances to reconnect on the issues of social justice, equity and diversity."

More than a year in the making, involving a committee of more than 75 educators,

leaders and staff, as well as input from thousands of members, the plan was presented to CTA's State Council, October 26-27, 2013, where it was greeted with enthusiasm and hope for change. State Council delegates will vote on adoption of the plan in January, after additional presentations and discussions with members at Service Center Council meetings, CTA trainings and conferences and local chapter meetings.
