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Bargaining Update 2021

Summer Survey Result Focus Negotiations on Class Size and Safety Protocols

2021 summer school will be unlike any year before. Students, teachers, related services, families, and administrators are transitioning from distance learning to in-person instruction. Member survey results *prioritize learning opportunities and classroom safety*.

The Board's Monday proposals on summer programs were absent improvements on class size and safety. The team, led by Assistant Superintendent, Human Resources Zepure Hacopian and Management Consultant Joe Krause, presented proposals on behalf of the board that are substantially less than the class size in last year's summer school MOUs and the safety protocols in the second semester distance learning MOU.

Our students deserve to come back to school this summer with manageable teacher-student ratios and clean, safe settings.

The District has much latitude in general summer school design since the funding is based on the Local Control Accountability Plan (LCAP) Supplemental and Concentration (L&C) funding.

Summer Programs Allow Us to Phase In School Based Programs

The law that currently allows distance learning will sunset in June. The Governor's May Revise suggests the state's direction will be in-person learning. *Summer can begin the process of returning to a pre-pandemic schedule* in addition to distance learning.

Board of Education Adopts Learning Opportunities Grant

Last night the BoE adopted a \$19 million Expanded Learning Opportunities plan. This state funding is designed to expand in-person instructional time and provide academic interventions and pupil supports to address barriers to learning and accelerate progress to close learning gaps. The Board expects a total of \$170 million stimulus funding to enhance learning opportunities and provide classroom safety.

The Association demands that summer school programs prioritize learning opportunities and class room safety. The Board needs to demand this as well.
