What Is the State Board of Education?

The SBE was established first by statute in 1852, then by

amendment to the California Constitution in 1884. Both the Constitution and statutes set forth the SBE's duties. Constitutional duties of the SBE include the appointment of one deputy and three associate superintendents upon nomination of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction (SSPI) and the adoption of textbooks for use in grades one through eight.

By statute, the SBE is the governing and policy-making body of the CDE. The Constitution and statute also assign the SBE a variety of other responsibilities:



- Standards
- Curriculum Frameworks
- Instructional Materials
- Waivers
- District Reorganization
- Charter Schools
- Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)
- Funding Allocations
